



Beachwood Kehilla Pesach Cheat Sheet 5786

Monday 3/30 – 12 Nisan

- a. Last chance to sell Chametz through Rabbi Spiegler is immediately following Mincha/Maariv.

Tuesday Night 3/31 – 14 Nisan

- a. 7:40 pm Mincha/Maariv.
- b. Bedikat Chametz, the search for the Chametz, should start as soon as possible after 8:32 pm. Activities, like starting a meal, should not take place up to a half-hour before.
- c. Remember to say the Bracha and to remain silent, aside from matters having to do with the search, until the search is completed.
- d. The nullification, Kol Chamira, said after the search, should be said (also) in a language that the reader can understand.
- e. The Bracha and the Kol Chamira can be found on page 654 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 2 of the Artscroll Machzor.
 - i. If one is leaving before Tuesday night for Pesach, they should do the Bedika the night before they leave without the Bracha.

Wednesday 4/1 – 14 Nisan

Erev Pesach

- a. During Shacharit we skip Mizmor L'Todah and LaMinatzeach.
- b. It is customary that all firstborn males fast on Erev Pesach. If one partakes in a Siyum, the completion of a unit of Torah study, they can opt-out of their fast.
 - i. There will be a siyum after the 6:55 am Minyan.

- c. The last time to eat Chametz is at 10:59 am.
- d. One should be sure to destroy all Chametz and to nullify the Chametz again before 12:14 pm.
 - i. Again, please be sure to say the Kol Chamira in a language that is understood.
 - ii. The Kol Chamira can be found on page 654 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 2 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- e. On Erev Pesach, we refrain from eating Matzah or foods with Matzah in them until the Seder.
- f. After Chatzot, Halachic midday, at 1:30 pm, one should treat Erev Pesach as though it were Chol HaMoed. Any preparations that can be done before Chatzot should be done before Chatzot.
- g. One should not eat a large meal after around 4:35 pm in order to save ones appetite for the Matzah to be eaten later at the Seder.
 - i. For more on Erev Pesach, please see the Pre-Pesach Cheat Sheet.
- h. We will make an Eiruv Tavshilin in order to allow us to prepare for our Shabbat meals on the day of Yom Tov that precedes Shabbat.
 - i. The Eiruv Tavshilin involves taking a baked item, Matzah, and a cooked food, like meat, fish, or an egg, and saying a Bracha and a short declaration.
 - ii. The Eiruv Tavshilin service can be found on pg. 4 of the Artscroll Machzor and pg. 654 of the Artscroll Siddur.

Wednesday Night 4/1 – 15 Nisan

Leil HaSeder

- a. Candle Lighting is at 7:33 pm.
 - i. The Bracha of L'HaDlik Ner Shel Yom Tov and the Bracha of SheHeChiyanu are said.
 - ii. Candle Lighting can be found on page 296 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 6 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- b. Kiddush at the Seder can not start before nightfall, 8:34 pm. SheHeChiyanu is said.
 - i. Kiddush can be found on page 658 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 86 of the Artscroll Machzor. It will also be found in any Haggadah.
 - ii. One should repeat Kriyat Shma at 8:34 pm before Kiddush.
- c. One should be sure to fulfill all of the Mitzvot of the Seder night:
 - i. Relating the story of the Exodus (Reading the Haggadah).
 - ii. Eating Matzah.
 - iii. Drinking four cups of wine.
 - iv. Eating Marror, bitter herbs.
 - v. Reciting Hallel.
 - vi. Eating the Afikoman Matzah in place of the Korban Pesach, paschal lamb.
 - vii. Demonstrating acts of freedom specifically through leaning as we eat Matzah and drink wine.

- d. One should be sure to eat the Afikoman before Chatzot, Halachic midnight, at 1:27 am.
 - i. However, it is preferable to conclude the entire Seder by this time.

- e. When the Seder is over many have the custom to continue discussing the Exodus or reciting Shir HaShirim until they fall asleep.
- f. Seder Night is considered a "Leil Shimurim," a guarded night. As such, for the bedtime Shma only the Shma and the Bracha of HaMapil are said (page 288 in the Artscroll Siddur).

Thursday 4/2 – 15 Nisan

- a. The typical Yom Tov Tefillah is said. Minyan will start at 9:00 am.
- b. We also include Tefillat Tal, the prayer for Dew, page 702 of the Artscroll Siddur, or page 416 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- c. Kiddush on page 492 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 456 of the Artscroll Machzor, is made up of the Pesukim (VaY'Kra 23:4,44) and the Bracha of Borei Pri HaGefen
- d. Bentsching can be found in any Haggadah, page 104 in the Artscroll Machzor, or page 182 in the Artscroll Siddur.

We mention Pesach in Bentsching (throughout all of Pesach) in the Yaaleh V'YaVo paragraph.
- e. Mincha will be at 7:35 pm.
- f. Candle Lighting is no earlier than 8:35 pm.
 - i. The Bracha of L'HaDlik Ner Shel Yom Tov and the Bracha of SheHeChiyanu are said.
 1. Candle Lighting can be found on page 296 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 6 of the Artscroll Machzor.
 - ii. No preparations for the second day should start before this point.
 - iii. One should repeat Kriyat Shma immediately after Candle Lighting.
 - iv. The Seder can start right after Candle Lighting.
- g. The second Seder is, for all intents and purposes, exactly as the first.

- h. One should be sure to eat the Afikoman before Chatzot, Halachic midnight, at 1:27 am.
 - i. However, it is preferable to conclude the entire Seder by this time.
- i. Tonight is the first night of Sefirat HaOmer, the counting of the Omer. The Bracha and the counting of the Omer can be found on page 284-286 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 80 of the Artscroll Machzor.

Friday 4/3 – 16 Nisan

- a. The typical Yom Tov Tefillah is said. Minyan will start at 9:00 am.
- b. Kiddush, on page 492 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 456 of the Artscroll Machzor, is made up of the Pesukim (VaYiKra 23:4,44) and the Bracha of Borei Pri HaGefen.

Friday 4/3 – 16 Nisan

Shabbat Chol HaMoed

- a. Candle Lighting is not before 7:35 pm, but we will be Davening Mincha at 7:00 pm.
 - i. The candles are lit as they would be on a standard Shabbat. Candle Lighting can be found on page 296 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 490 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- b. We say an abridged Kabbalat Shabbat, reciting just the last two paragraphs and omitting Bameh MaDlikin.
 - i. Kabbalat Shabbat can be found on page 320 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 490 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- c. We add YaAleh V'YaVo to our Shmoneh Esrei at Maariv.
- d. Kiddush is made like it would be on a standard Friday night.
 - i. Kiddush can be found on page 360 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 518 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- e. Kriat Shma should be repeated after 8:36 pm.
- f. Tonight is the second night of the Omer.

Shabbat 4/4 – 17 Nisan

Shabbat Chol HaMoed

- a. Davening begins at 9:00 am.
 - i. We add YaAleh V'YaVo in our Shacharit Shmoneh Esrei. We also say half-Hallel.
 - ii. We read the Megillah of Shir HaShirim before Torah reading.
 - iii. We say the Mussaf of Pesach with insertions for Shabbat.
- b. Kiddush is made as it would be on a standard Shabbat day.
 - i. Kiddush can be found on page 492 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 628 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- c. We mention Pesach in Bentching in the Yaaleh V'Yavo paragraph.
- d. Please eat Seudah Shlishit at home.
- e. Mincha is at 7:30 pm. We add YaAleh V'YaVo to our Shmoneh Esrei.
- f. In Maariv, we say Atah Chonantanu and add YaAleh V'YaVo.
- g. Remember to leave out MaShiv HaRuach and switch to V'Tein Bracha.
- h. Havdalah, at 8:42 pm, is made as it would be on a standard Motzaei Shabbat.
 - i. Havdalah can be found on page 618 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 686 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- i. Tonight is the third night of the Omer.

Saturday Night – Tuesday Night

Chol HaMoed

- a. Chol HaMoed should be treated as a holy day celebrated with special dress and meals, albeit not to the same extent as Yom Tov itself.
 - i. For more on what activities are permitted/forbidden on Chol HaMoed please see the Pre-Pesach Cheat Sheet.

- b. Throughout Chol HaMoed we say Yaaleh V'Yavo in Shmoneh Esrei and Bentching. We also add half-Hallel and Mussaf during Shacharit. We still leave out Mizmor L'Todah and LaMinatzeach.
 - i. Remember to leave out MaShiv HaRuach and switch to V'Tein Bracha.
- c. Remember to count Sefirat HaOmer.

Tuesday Night 4/7 – 20 Nisan

Second Days

- a. Candle Lighting and Davening are at 7:39 pm.
 - i. Only the Bracha of L'HaDlik Ner Shel Yom Tov is said.
 - ii. Candle Lighting can be found on page 296 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 796 of the Artscroll Machzor.
 - iii. Davening is at 7:40 pm.
- b. Kiddush is made with the Bracha of Borei Pri HaGefen and MiKadeish Yisrael V'HaZmanim.
 - i. Kiddush can be found on page 658 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 826 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- c. Kriyat Shma should be repeated after 8:41 pm.
- d. Tonight is the 6th night of the Omer.

Wednesday 4/8 – 21 Nisan

Shvii Shel Pesach

- a. The typical Yom Tov Tefillah is said. Minyan will start at 9:00 am.
- b. Kiddush, page 492 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 456 of the Artscroll Machzor, is made up of the Pesukim (VaYiKra 23:4,44) and the Bracha of Borei Pri HaGefen.
- c. We mention Pesach in Bentching in the Yaaleh V'Yavo paragraph.
- d. Mincha will be at 7:45 pm.

- e. Candle Lighting is no earlier than 8:42 pm.
 - i. Only the Bracha of L'HaDlik Ner Shel Yom Tov is said.
 - ii. Candle Lighting can be found on page 296 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 796 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- f. Kriyat Shma should be repeated after 8:42 pm.
- g. Tonight is the seventh night of the Omer.

Thursday 4/9 – 22 Nisan

Acharon Shel Pesach

- a. The typical Yom Tov Tefillah is said. Minyan will start at 9:00 am.
- b. Yizkor will be said.
- c. Kiddush, page 492 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 456 of the Artscroll Machzor, is made up of the Pesukim (VaY'Kra 23:4,44) and the Bracha of Borei Pri HaGefen.
- d. We mention Pesach in Bentching in the Yaaleh V'Yavo paragraph.
- e. Mincha will be at 7:50 pm.
- f. In Maariv, we say Atah Chonantanu.
- g. Havdalah is at 8:43 pm. It will only involve a cup of wine, but no candle or spices.
 - i. It can be found on page 618 of the Artscroll Siddur or page 1102 of the Artscroll Machzor.
- h. Please be sure to wait until around 9:45 pm for the Chametz to be bought back.
 - i. Tonight is the eighth night of the Omer.
